UNDER DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS: ELECTRICAL SUPERINTENDENT JIM MOREHEAD REPORTED THREE OVERTIMES RELATING TO WEATHER. CHANGING OUT LIGHTS AT THE BASEBALL FIELD; ADDRESSED POWER OUTAGE AT THE COOP; AEREATOR AT CRYSTAL SPRINGS ENERGIZED; CAMPING SITES ALL ENERGIZED; TRIMMING TREES; SPRAYING; PLANNING FOR THE MOVING OF POWER POLES IN THE PATH OF KEYSTONE PIPELINE; PRICING PROVIDING POWER TO NEW GRAIN BINS. WATER SUPERINTENDENT JEFF SWEETSER REPORTED NO OVERTIME. THERE IS NO UPDATE ON THE ISSUE AT THE TREATMENT PLANT DUE TO VACATIONS AT THE ENGINEERS OFFICES; LEAD/COPPER SAMPLES HAVE BEEN RECEIVED – LEAD TESTED “GOOD” AND THE COPPER “NOT GOOD”. IT APPEARS THAT THERE MAY HAVE BEEN A

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MISSEDPLACED DECIMAL ON THE TEST REPORT FOR COPPER IN A PAST REPORT WHICH IS NOW CORRECTED. SAMPLES WILL BE TAKEN AGAIN IN SIX MONTHS TO VERIFY THIS ASSUMPTION; REOPENED PLAYGROUND AT CRYSTAL SPRINGS; EXPERIENCING WEED GROWTH IN THE NEWLY SEEDED AREAS FROM IMPORTED TOPSOIL; SPRAYING WEEDS; STILL PUMPING FROM THE EAST WELLS; WATER USEAGE FOR THE PREVIOUS WEEK WAS 1,054,000 GAL/DAY.

MS. RENN REPORTED THAT THE WATER CONTRACT WITH KEYSTONE PIPELINE HAS BEEN FULLY EXECUTED. MEAN HAS DELIVERED TO THE CITY CHECK FOR \$150,665.00 FOR EXCESS CHARGES.

MS. RENN REVIEWED FINANCES WITH THE BOARD. OUTSTANDING ACCOUNTS WERE PRESENTED.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS THE MEETING WAS ADJOURNED AT 08:55 A.M.
